High School STEM Students Tour Mason

George Mason University hosted the 4th annual Environmental Action Showcase April 9 at the Center for the Arts. This event opened the way for high school students on track for STEM majors to tour Mason.

Amanda Sills, a graduate environment and policy student, led 36 students and teachers through the school with the help of Nick Stasiak, a Mason Ambassador, and Rachel Kenderdine, an intern at the Office of Admissions.
